WELCOME TO GUTHRIE ENRICHMENT

The Guthrie Enrichment program offers an array of small group, instructor-led classes designed to perfectly complement your student's traditional academic courses. Classes are offered in a variety of disciplines in order to address the academic needs and interests of students. With a variety of class choices, caring and experienced teachers, and a breadth of curriculum, we offer our students the diverse educational experience and individualized attention he or she needs to succeed.

Our classes are ability-grouped and are designed to teach and reinforce lessons on a weekly basis. Classes meet once a week, and during this time, students are taught a lesson, introduced to a variety of activities to practice the skills taught, and assigned homework to reinforce. Additionally, students are expected to achieve and maintain organization by using the folder and assignment log provided to them at their first class.

Students who attend writing classes other than that offered by The Guthrie School are not eligible to apply for private instruction.

ENRICHMENT FAQ'S

Q: What is Guthrie Enrichment?

A: Guthrie Enrichment is an enrichment and tutoring program that provides advanced academic classes in a variety of subject areas. Our goal is to inspire a student's love of learning and challenge them to meet their academic potential.

Q: What are the hours of the Enrichment classes?

A: Tuesday-Thursday after school and Saturday morning.

Q: What feedback will I get about my child's progress?

A: We believe that parents, students and teachers are a team, and to that end we encourage open communication. Student work will be graded and returned for students and parents to review.

Q: How do I pay?

A: Tuition is calculated based on the number of hours your student will be attending class per week. Tuition is paid by the semester and payments may be made by cash, check, ACH or credit card (3.5% fee).

Q: Are classes held over student holidays?

A: A calendar is published prior to the start of each semester. Tuition is calculated with these holidays in mind, and you are not charged for the dates The Guthrie School is closed.

Q: What curriculum do we use?

A: We use a variety of curriculum to best serve our students. We keep up to date with Texas standards and utilize a wide variety of sources to help meet our students' individual needs.

Q: How does the curriculum compare to what is taught in public schools?

A: Our curriculum intentionally overlaps with curriculum taught in both private and public schools. Our classes are designed to teach depth of content and to develop problem solving skills. While the skills taught overlap, the methods applied to teach our students vary and are designed to meet the needs of the students in the class.

Q: How much work is assigned each class?

A: For most classes, a student will take home approximately 1 hour of homework. We advise that homework be completed throughout the week rather than all in one night.

Q: What ages do we teach?

A: Guthrie Enrichment serves students from Pre-Kindergarten through Middle School.

Q: Does my student have to be a Guthrie School student to attend Guthrie Enrichment?

A: No! The Guthrie School Enrichment Program welcomes students from any school, race, color, religion, and national or ethnic origin.

Q: How do I know the appropriate level for my student?

A: We listen to parent feedback, look to current coursework and scores, and may require an assessment prior to your student beginning classes. Progress is continually monitored for content understanding and mastery, and should it come to pass that their current level is no longer meeting their needs, we will contact you regarding adjusting their schedule.

Q: How do you handle discipline?

A: The Guthrie School reserves the right to dismiss from its program any student whose conduct is unsatisfactory, who fails to conform to the rules and regulations or who is unable or unwilling to participate in a group setting. No refund or transfer of tuition to another program will be made upon a student's withdrawal or dismissal from any enrichment program due to discipline or inability to participate. The Guthrie School staff and teachers follow our discipline policy, which is part of the registration packet.

Q: What if I am running late?

A: If you are running late for class, please call 972.596.6929 to notify the front office.

Q: When can I register for the next semester?

A: Schedules for the upcoming semester are released prior to the beginning of the new semester. We encourage you to sign up as early as possible as class space is limited and spaces fill up quickly.

Q: How do I register for Private Lessons?

A: Private lessons are offered to current private lesson students first. If you are interested in private lessons, you will be put on the waitlist. ACADEMIC COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Writing (Primer-2nd): Young writers will build essential pre-writing skills while learning how to organize their thoughts using brainstorming techniques and graphic organizers. Students will explore a variety of writing genres—such as narratives, opinion pieces, and informative texts—and gain experience with each stage of the writing process, from planning to publishing. Through fun prompts and creative activities, this course nurtures confident, expressive, and independent writers.

Writing (3rd-5th): Students will develop their writing skills in this writing workshop. Students will learn to write well-developed, multi-paragraph essays, as well as creative fiction and nonfiction. There will also be an emphasis on grammar, editing, and proofreading skills. Each week, students will work towards improving their own writing, as well as work with their peers to improve their understanding of the writing process. Students can expect about one hour of homework or less per week for this class.

Computer Skills: Students in grades 3-6 will develop their computer skills during the computer skills lab. Students will work towards developing their typing skills and improving their words-per-minute rate over the course of the semester. Students will also learn to use word processors, like Google Docs, and presentation programs, like Google Slides. Each week, students will work on an assigned computer skills project in addition to typing skills practice. Students can expect half an hour of homework or less per week for this class. Students must bring their own computer and charger to class, and must have login credentials and access to the Google Suite.

ISEE: Designed for students preparing to take the Lower and Middle Level ISEE, this course builds the core skills and strategies needed to succeed on test day. Students will strengthen their reading comprehension, vocabulary, math reasoning, and quantitative skills through targeted lessons and practice tests. With a focus on time management, critical thinking, and test-taking techniques, this course empowers students to approach the ISEE with confidence and perform at their best.

Math: Join us on a fun-filled adventure through the world of numbers! In our Math classes, students will build a strong foundation in early math skills through hands-on activities, games, and engaging stories. Based on the students' grade level, we will explore counting, patterns, shapes, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, and problem-solving in ways that spark curiosity and confidence. Perfect for young learners, this class encourages creativity, critical thinking, and a love for math!

Building Character: In *Building Character*, students learn what it means to be kind, respectful, and responsible through stories, songs, role-playing, and fun group activities. This course helps young learners build empathy, confidence, and strong friendships while practicing important life skills like sharing, listening, and expressing emotions in healthy ways. With a warm and supportive environment, students grow not just as learners—but as caring members of their community.

Phonics: Our Phonics course introduces young learners to the building blocks of reading through engaging, hands-on activities that make learning letters and sounds exciting! Students will explore letter recognition, phonemic awareness, and sound blending as they begin to decode words and develop early reading confidence. Through stories, games, and movement, this course lays a strong foundation for literacy and sparks a lifelong love of reading. Perfect for pre-kindergarteners through primer students.

Speech & Presentation: Students will develop confidence and poise as they learn the fundamentals of effective public speaking and presentation. Through weekly practice, students will strengthen key skills such as posture, eye contact, voice projection, articulation, and expression. They will memorize and present speeches and monologues from a variety of sources, while also practicing interview techniques and performance strategies. Whether speaking in front of a class, a small group, or one-on-one, students will gain valuable tools to communicate clearly and confidently.
